6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

7.1 Precautions for safe handling:-

No special measures necessary if stored and handled as prescribed. Only adequately trained personnel should handle this product. For use in dentistry only. Ensure good ventilation/exhaustion at the workplace. Keep ignition sources away – do not smoke. Protect against electrostatic charges. Wash hands before breaks and after work. Do not eat, drink or smoke during work time. Remove soiled or soaked clothing immediately. Keep away from foodstuffs and beverages.

7.2 Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities:-Keep only in the original container. Containers which are opened must be carefully closed and kept upright to prevent leakage. Keep container tightly sealed. Protect from exposure to the light. Protect from heat and direct sunlight. Store in cool, dry conditions in well-sealed receptacles. Store receptacle in a well ventilated area. Recommended storage temperature for storage rooms and vessels is 20 - 30°C.
